15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The National Education Policy (NEP) envisions a transformative shift in higher education by advocating a multidisciplinary approach that bridges the gaps between academic disciplines. In the context of India, this approach aims to provide students with a holistic and enriched learning experience, fostering critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills. To successfully implement this vision, colleges must ensure collaboration among educators, administrators, policymakers, and other stakeholders, while also securing adequate resources, infrastructure, and support systems. Dr. B.K.B. College is committed to aligning itself with the goals of NEP 2020, aiming to create opportunities for multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary engagement that attract new students and produce skilled graduates. Currently, the college offers programs such as B.A., B.Com., and B.Voc. (self-financed) under Gauhati University along with diploma in ICT and Cosmetology, skill-based training programmes of Web Developer, Gym Assistant and Yoga Instructor under PMKVY, and certificate courses. However, there is substantial potential to enhance multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary academic activities within its existing framework. By strategically selecting courses and subjects within the available options, the college can foster a multidisciplinary learning environment. Initiatives such as integrated curricula, collaborative projects, cross-disciplinary research, and flexible combinations of majors and minors can broaden students' academic horizons. Additionally, interdepartmental faculty exchange programs and community outreach initiatives, such as those involving NCC and NSS volunteers, can further enhance interdisciplinary engagement. Experiential learning opportunities, including fieldwork, extension activities, project reports, and assignments, already provide students with hands-on experiences that complement

classroom learning. To advance its multidisciplinary vision, the college prioritizes the introduction of a Science stream at the undergraduate level, the inclusion of new subjects in the Arts stream, and the provincialization of Commerce and B.Voc. programs. While achieving a comprehensive multidisciplinary framework requires time and significant effort, Dr. B.K.B. College is dedicated to embracing academic flexibility and integrating knowledge with skill development. This holistic approach will prepare students to navigate the complexities of the modern world and contribute meaningfully to society.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As an affiliated institution of Gauhati University, Dr. B.K.B. College does not directly manage or administer the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), which remains under the central purview of the parent university. However, the college is committed to supporting students in effectively navigating the ABC system through the proactive involvement of its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The IQAC plays a pivotal role in guiding students to understand and utilize the ABC framework efficiently. By organizing regular orientation programs, workshops, and one-onone counseling sessions, the IQAC ensures that students are wellinformed about the guidelines and processes of credit management. Additionally, the cell provide consistent supervision, helping students monitor their academic progress and credit accumulation seamlessly. Although Dr. B.K.B. College does not directly administer the ABC, it remains steadfast in its dedication to empowering students to make the most of this innovative system. Through robust guidance and support, the college aims to enhance students' academic journeys and contribute to their overall educational advancement.

17.Skill development:

The pressing issue of employability in today's world highlights the need to embed ready-to-use soft skills into the curriculum. While traditional humanities education often focuses on situational, critical, and creative thinking rather than direct employability, efforts to bridge this gap are increasingly necessary. Recognizing this, our college has introduced B.Voc. Degree and Diploma courses aimed at skill enhancement and employability, fostering self-reliance among young learners. These initiatives are already yielding results, with students pursuing diploma courses in Cosmetology, Performing Arts, and Computer Application showing a keen interest in career-oriented paths. To address the need for vocational training and align with

NEP 2020, the college has also introduced Certificate Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses to increase the employability of the students. Many of our students, rooted in rural traditions, already possess innate skills in weaving, culinary arts, indigenous crafts, and more. This provides a natural foundation for orienting them towards diverse fields such as Food Processing and Preservation, Beauty Therapy and Hair Cutting, Farm Management, and Entrepreneurship Development. The NEP 2020 emphasizes "learning by doing," encouraging creative imagination and critical thinking that transcend theoretical knowledge. In this spirit, the college has introduced a Certificate Course on Creative and Critical Thinking, designed to cultivate an appreciation for arts and crafts, classical music, and painting. IQAC of the college has launched three skill development programs under PMKVY of Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. These included practical training programmes on ICT and Beauty and Wellness Sectors. To further enhance soft skills, the college offers opportunities to learn skills like Data Analysis and Project Report Preparation, Art of Speaking and Writing in English, and Computer Application. These initiatives aim to equip students with practical skills and a competitive edge, preparing them for dynamic career opportunities and fostering holistic development.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Within the existing Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) syllabi in the humanities, concerted efforts have been made to integrate various aspects of ancient Indian culture and knowledge, creating meaningful connections across disciplines like aesthetics, literature, socio-political thought, education, and values. For example, students pursuing English Honours engage with a curriculum that balances Western and Indian traditions through complementary papers-one focusing on Western aesthetics and literature, and the other on Indian aesthetics, drama, and epic narratives. This approach ensures exposure to both traditions, fostering a comprehensive understanding of literary heritage. The inclusion of elements from the Indian knowledge system enriches the curriculum while instilling a sense of pride and connection to India's cultural roots. Additionally, acknowledging the contemporary significance of traditional practices, a course on Yoga for health and another skill based programme on Yoga Instructor under PMKVY have been introduced to address modern wellness needs. These course not only promotes holistic wellbeing but also celebrates the historical and cultural

significance of Yoga, exemplifying how traditional knowledge can be harmoniously integrated with current trends to create an innovative and culturally resonant educational experience. Online platforms like SWAYAM can host IKS-focused courses, enabling students to learn at their own pace through engaging formats like virtual reality and gamification. The NEP also emphasizes teacher training, interdisciplinary approaches, and inclusion, ensuring that faculty and students alike benefit from a holistic, culturally grounded, and globally relevant education.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The rapidly evolving socio-economic landscape necessitates a strong focus on outcome-based education to address changing demands effectively. In response, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and NEP curriculums of the college have been strategically updated to integrate skill components that prioritize experiential learning and practical application. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) have been introduced to equip students with competencies aligned with real-world requirements. Apart from these compulsory SEC, numerous skill development peogrammes have also been launched to equip students with the basic skills to make them more employable. To support this transition, faculty members are undergoing in-service training programs aimed at enhancing their professional capabilities and aligning teaching methodologies with the principles of Bloom's Taxonomy for targeted skill development. Despite resource constraints, efforts are being made to ensure that course offerings achieve measurable learning outcomes. In accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the parent university has also introduced new courses that address contemporary challenges. Dr. B.K.B. College, while adhering to the broader framework, retains autonomy in course selection, enabling the institution to utilize local resources and opportunities effectively. This approach ensures a dynamic and outcome-oriented educational experience that aligns national priorities with regional needs, fostering both academic and practical excellence.

20.Distance education/online education:

Adapting to the evolving educational landscape, Dr. B.K.B. College has emerged as a prominent hub for distance learning by operating two centers in collaboration with esteemed institutions. Partnering with Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) and the Center for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) under Gauhati University, the college offers a diverse array of undergraduate and postgraduate programs. These

programs attract learners from across the district and have achieved remarkable success, with students consistently completing their courses on time. At the heart of this success is the college's robust digital education infrastructure, which enables faculty members to deliver dynamic online classes, share detailed study materials, and create engaging video tutorials. The seamless online portal further streamlines assignment submissions and feedback, ensuring an efficient and user-friendly learning process. Emphasizing multimedia learning, the college prioritizes the production of audio-visual educational content, enriching the student experience while fostering creativity and engagement. This forward-thinking approach has positioned the college as a leader in delivering accessible, effective, and innovative distance education.

Gender issues are addressed through BA courses in English, History, Education, Assamese, and Sociology, along with extension activities on Women's Day and related topics. Institutional initiatives like the Anti-ragging and Sexual Harassment Committee, Women Forum, and Women's Aid promote gender equality. Human values are integrated into BA Political Science and Sociology courses, covering Human Rights and Ethics, supported by extension activities that instill social responsibility. Environmental sustainability is emphasized through the compulsory Environmental Studies paper, addressing ecological concerns, while Environmental Economics in BA Economics examines environmental policies and damage assessment. Geography, Education, and Political Science courses also focus on sustainability. Institutional initiatives include Green and Energy Audits, a Tobacco-Free Campus, and a Plastic-Free Zone. Extension activities mark Environment Day and related events to enhance awareness. The college ensures equal development and a national sense of belonging while promoting ethical responsibility, gender equity, and environmental consciousness through academic and institutional efforts.

To achieve effective learning outcomes, the institution employs diverse assessment methods, including major tests, class tests, classroom interactions, home assignments, sessional examinations, and post-lesson reviews. Based on evaluations, tailored strategies are implemented to support students who face challenges and to enrich advanced learners.

For students requiring additional support, remedial classes and resessional examinations provide extra practice, while emotional and academic support, including counseling and morale-boosting initiatives, nurture confidence. Simplified reading materials and bilingual instruction, with explanations in local languages, address diverse learning needs. Access to departmental libraries and mentor-mentee meetings ensures personalized guidance. Parents are regularly updated on academic progress and involved in support efforts. By transitioning students from passive to active participants, this methodology enhances confidence and nurtures analytical and creative thinking.

Faculty members employ diverse methods to make learning interactive and engaging. These include the use of ICT tools, PowerPoint presentations, audio-visual classes, and hands-on learning through practical sessions in laboratories like GIS, Sattriya, Psychology, and Computer Science. Activities such as group discussions, departmental seminars, field trips, project reports, and assignments further promote participative learning.

Specialized programs like certificate and diploma courses in yoga, gym assistant, web developer, computer applications, and Sattriya, along with vocational courses in IT and physical education, provide experiential learning opportunities. Students participate actively in literary events, cultural programs, and national celebrations like Independence Day and World Environment Day, fostering teamwork and social responsibility.

Problem-solving skills are enhanced through committee involvement, extension activities, statistical data analysis courses, and training for different life skills. Interactive sessions, webinars, seminars, faculty exchange programs, and institutional YouTube channels, help desk during the time of admission and examination form fill up further enrich the learning environment.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

Since the academic year 2018-19, Dr. B.K.B. College has prioritized the integration of ICT tools to create an engaging, interactive, and learner-centered classroom environment. While ICT serves as a facilitator, the true essence of effective education lies in the expertise and pedagogical knowledge of teachers. Faculty members play a pivotal role as facilitators, guiding students to utilize technology responsibly and creatively for learning, exploration, analysis, and presentation.

The college boasts nine classrooms equipped with smart boards, projectors, mini sound modifiers, and other digital tools. Facilities include laptops for each department, a GIS laboratory, a computer lab, video conferencing equipment, digital repositories, and access to e-resources through subscriptions like NLIST.

To enhance faculty proficiency, a Faculty Development Program (FDP) was organized in November 2018, with continuous workshops and training sessions conducted thereafter. During lockdowns, the college ensured uninterrupted learning by seamlessly transitioning to online platforms, leveraging ICT tools for classes and e-resource utilization.

Departments also utilize social media and web platforms, such as WhatsApp and departmental websites, for sharing materials, assignments, and updates. Online events, including webinars, mentor-mentee meetings, and alumni interactions, further enrich the academic environment. SSS and Feedbacks are received through

college portal and analyzed by using different software like Excel and SPSS. PTM, Mentor-Mentee Meet, Alumni Meet are also conducted on line with good response

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

Dr. B.K.B. College upholds transparency and effectiveness in its internal assessment policy, ensuring a fair and comprehensive evaluation of students. The policy includes three key components: assignments and related tasks, attendance, and sessional examinations, aligning with the evaluation guidelines of Gauhati University.

Assignments and Other Tasks: Heads of Departments (HoDs) assign projects, seminars, group discussions, fieldwork, and cocurricular activities, with details shared through classroom interactions, notice boards, and WhatsApp groups. These tasks contribute 30% of the internal assessment marks based on student performance.

Attendance: HoDs communicate the attendance policy in class, with marks calculated at the semester's end, constituting 20% of the total internal assessment.

Sessional Examinations: The Academic Committee schedules sessional exams as per the academic calendar. An internal examination committee, led by Assistant Officers-in-Charge (AOCs), oversees the process. HoDs prepare question papers, while AOCs handle logistics, invigilation duties, and answer script management. Evaluated scripts are reviewed by HoDs, with results declared within a week via notice boards, WhatsApp, and the college website.

Students with valid reasons can apply for re-sessional exams. Answer scripts are shown to students for feedback, promoting continuous improvement. Final results are submitted to Gauhati University, ensuring a transparent and rigorous assessment process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

- 4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.
- Dr. B.K.B. College is committed to providing high-quality education despite challenges related to limited infrastructure. The institution optimizes its resources to enhance teaching, learning, and curriculum activities. The college has 22 classrooms, 11 of which are equipped with advanced ICT tools for interactive learning. A seminar and conference room facilitates academic events, while four specialized laboratories support studies in GIS, Computer Science, Instrumentation (Education & Psychology), and Performing Arts. The partially Wi-Fi-enabled campus houses 72 computers for academic and administrative purposes, with each department having a laptop and a departmental library.

The centrally located, partially automated library holds 17,256 books, 8 journals, 10 magazines, and 15 newspapers. It features two servers, four computer clients, D-Space software, and barcode readers. Students and faculty have access to e-resources via N-list, E-Shodhsindhu, e-books, and e-journals. The college also offers a modern 200-seat auditorium for academic and cultural programs.

Additional facilities include a women's hostel, canteen, common rooms, gymnasium, yoga center, sports amenities, and the Bapuji Playground nearby. Solar-powered lighting, CCTV, biometric systems, and ramps ensure safety and accessibility, fostering holistic student growth.

Sports Facilities: The college utilizes the nearby Bapuji Library Playground under a formal MoU for outdoor sports, including basketball, supported by an on-campus basketball court. It is well-equipped with necessary sports gear for both outdoor and indoor games, organized within the campus.

Gymnasium: The college hosts a well-maintained, fully-equipped gymnasium accessible to students, faculty, and the local community at affordable rates. Supervised by a certified instructor, the Teacher-in-Charge, and the Students' Union Secretary, the gym promotes physical fitness and wellness. Additionally, students enrolled in the Gym Assistant programme under PMKVY use equipment at DJ Fitness Center, Puranigudam.

Yoga Centre: The Yoga and Meditation Centre focuses on mental and physical well-being, offering a certificate course in Yoga for Health and a Yoga Instructor programme under PMKVY, fostering

stress management and mindfulness.

Cultural Activities: The college promotes creativity through cultural events in its 200-seat auditorium and two open stages. These activities enhance artistic skills, confidence, communication, and teamwork, supporting personal and mental growth.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The Central Library of Dr. B.K.B. College, established in 1967, has been a vital academic resource, continually evolving to meet users' needs. It houses a comprehensive collection of textbooks, reference books, journals, magazines, and newspapers. Operating on an open access system, it ensures convenient resource availability for students and faculty.

The library offers essential services, including Circulation, Reprography, OPAC, Reference Services, and a Book Bank for economically disadvantaged students. Annual orientation programs introduce new students to its facilities. Security measures include CCTV surveillance and a barcode system for efficient book management.

Embracing technology, the library developed an institutional repository using 'DSpace' and provides e-journals and e-books via the NLIST program since 2011. In 2019, most users registered for the National Digital Library of India (NDLI), and in 2021, the college joined the NDLI Club, expanding e-resource access.

Library automation began in 2010 with SOUL 1.0, upgraded to SOUL 2.0 in 2012, and recently to SOUL 3.0. Key modules like Circulation, Cataloguing, OPAC, and Administration are fully automated, while Acquisition and Serial Control are under development, reflecting the library's commitment to modernization.

A key milestone in this journey is the comprehensive redesign and sustained maintenance of the institutional portal, ensuring enhanced accessibility and functionality. The introduction of an online admission portal in 2019 revolutionized the enrollment process, streamlining operations for greater efficiency. The college website has also undergone substantial upgrades, integrating features that enrich online education and student engagement. These include Live Discussions, Online Classes, Class Notes, Teaching-Learning Materials (TLM), Mentor-Mentee interactions, and a Grievance Redressal mechanism. Additionally, an online leave application system has improved administrative efficiency.

In library automation, the Central Library, partially automated with SOUL 2.0, has recently transitioned to SOUL 3.0, optimizing resource management. The campus is equipped with robust Wi-Fi and LAN connectivity, ensuring seamless internet access. State-of-the-art smart classrooms with advanced ICT tools foster interactive learning experiences. Moreover, a biometric attendance system has been implemented to enhance staff accountability and administrative oversight. These strategic advancements underscore the college's commitment to a technology-driven academic ecosystem.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

Dr. B.K.B. College follows a decentralized and participatory management approach, engaging multiple stakeholders in decision-making and implementation. The Governing Body, as the highest authority, and the Principal cum Secretary provide leadership, while various committees ensure inclusive participation at different levels.

A key example of this approach is the Admission Committee, which reflects decentralization and collective management. The committee includes the Principal as President, the Vice-Principal as Convener, and the IQAC Coordinator as Coordinator. Other members include representatives from teaching and non-teaching staff, SC/ST/OBC/Minority communities, NCC, NSS, and the Students' Union. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/perspective plan is effectively deployed

Dr. B.K.B. College has been actively enhancing its activities post-accreditation through a well-structured Strategic/Perspective Plan. This plan focuses on long-term objectives such as departmental expansion, fund mobilization, infrastructure development, digital facility enhancement, library upgrades, and extension activities. Additionally, the college formulates an annual Perspective Plan (Finance), outlining budgetary allocations and income sources. An Academic Calendar is also strictly followed for systematic academic planning.

One successfully implemented activity is the 'Computer for Computer Rooms' project under the RUSA Infrastructure Grant. This initiative facilitated the computer lab for Certificate and Diploma courses in Computer Applications, B.Voc in IT, and other scholastic purposes. Another notable project is the construction of an open stage, designed to create a flexible performance space.

The implementation process includes several key steps: drafting a Perspective Plan, advertising in newspapers, conducting Technical and Financial Bid evaluations, issuing work orders, procuring materials, and ensuring GST-compliant invoicing. Funds are released through PFMS in installments, with inspections ensuring compliance with work orders. Finally, the project is completed with a Utilization Certificate submitted to RUSA, marking successful execution.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

Dr. B.K.B. College follows a dual-tier governance system, comprising administrative and academic sectors. The Governing Body, headed by a President, serves as the highest policy-making authority, with the Principal acting as its Secretary and holding the final say in academic matters. A structured hierarchy ensures clarity in duties, responsibilities, and authority at all levels.

The Principal is supported by the Vice Principal, Heads of Departments (HoDs), the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), and various internal committees. The administrative setup is led by the Principal, followed by the Vice Principal and HoDs. Within each department, HoDs oversee Associate Professors and Assistant Professors. The library functions under a librarian, supported by library assistants and bearers.

Internal committees play a crucial role in managing various institutional responsibilities. Each committee is led by a Convener or Coordinator, usually a senior faculty member, with assistance from other faculty and, in some cases, student representatives.

Service rules adhere strictly to the regulations of competent authorities like UGC and DHE Assam for permanent staff regarding appointments, promotions, and leave policies. Guidelines for contractual staff are formulated by the college authority in alignment with institutional policies and official notifications.

- Dr. B.K.B. College prioritizes environmental sustainability and implements comprehensive waste management practices to minimize its ecological footprint.

Solid Waste Management: Waste segregation is conducted at the

source, ensuring effective disposal of degradable and non-degradable materials. Approximately 25 large bins are strategically placed across Campus-1 and Campus-2 for systematic waste collection. Degradable waste is transferred daily by designated cleaning personnel to an on-campus vermin composting unit, where it undergoes decomposition. The resultant organic matter is then utilized as nutrient-rich manure for the college's gardens. Non-degradable waste, on the other hand, is disposed of in a designated burning pit within the campus premises.

Liquid Waste Disposal: The institution has an efficient drainage system that channels liquid waste generated from the canteen, hostel, and lavatories into designated soak pits.

E-Waste Management: Non-functional electronic equipment, including computer peripherals, printers, and scientific instruments, is systematically stored in a designated facility. Other electrical items, such as fans, lighting fixtures, water pumps, and defunct aqua guards, are housed separately. Reusable components undergo periodic repair and reintegration into the system, while irreparable e-waste is auctioned following the prescribed institutional protocols.

By transitioning students from passive to active participants, this methodology enhances confidence and nurtures analytical and creative thinking.

Faculty members employ diverse methods to make learning interactive and engaging. These include the use of ICT tools, PowerPoint presentations, audio-visual classes, and hands-on learning through practical sessions in laboratories like GIS, Sattriya, Psychology, and Computer Science. Activities such as group discussions, departmental seminars, field trips, project reports, and assignments further promote participative learning.

Specialized programs like certificate and diploma courses in yoga, gym assistant, web developer, computer applications, and

Sattriya, along with vocational courses in IT and physical education, provide experiential learning opportunities. Students participate actively in literary events, cultural programs, and national celebrations like Independence Day and World Environment Day, fostering teamwork and social responsibility.

Problem-solving skills are enhanced through committee involvement, extension activities, statistical data analysis courses, and training for different life skills. Interactive sessions, webinars, seminars, faculty exchange programs, and institutional YouTube channels, help desk during the time of admission and examination form fill up further enrich the learning environment.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

Since the academic year 2018-19, Dr. B.K.B. College has prioritized the integration of ICT tools to create an engaging, interactive, and learner-centered classroom environment. While ICT serves as a facilitator, the true essence of effective education lies in the expertise and pedagogical knowledge of teachers. Faculty members play a pivotal role as facilitators, guiding students to utilize technology responsibly and creatively for learning, exploration, analysis, and presentation.

The college boasts nine classrooms equipped with smart boards, projectors, mini sound modifiers, and other digital tools. Facilities include laptops for each department, a GIS laboratory, a computer lab, video conferencing equipment, digital repositories, and access to e-resources through subscriptions like NLIST.

To enhance faculty proficiency, a Faculty Development Program (FDP) was organized in November 2018, with continuous workshops and training sessions conducted thereafter. During lockdowns,

the college ensured uninterrupted learning by seamlessly transitioning to online platforms, leveraging ICT tools for classes and e-resource utilization.

Departments also utilize social media and web platforms, such as WhatsApp and departmental websites, for sharing materials, assignments, and updates. Online events, including webinars, mentor-mentee meetings, and alumni interactions, further enrich the academic environment. SSS and Feedbacks are received through college portal and analyzed by using different software like Excel and SPSS. PTM, Mentor-Mentee Meet, Alumni Meet are also conducted on line with good response

Dr. B.K.B. College upholds transparency and effectiveness in its internal assessment policy, ensuring a fair and comprehensive evaluation of students. The policy includes three key components: assignments and related tasks, attendance, and sessional examinations, aligning with the evaluation guidelines of Gauhati University.

Assignments and Other Tasks: Heads of Departments (HoDs) assign projects, seminars, group discussions, fieldwork, and cocurricular activities, with details shared through classroom interactions, notice boards, and WhatsApp groups. These tasks contribute 30% of the internal assessment marks based on student performance.

Attendance: HoDs communicate the attendance policy in class, with marks calculated at the semester's end, constituting 20% of the total internal assessment.

Sessional Examinations: The Academic Committee schedules sessional exams as per the academic calendar. An internal examination committee, led by Assistant Officers-in-Charge (AOCs), oversees the process. HoDs prepare question papers, while AOCs handle logistics, invigilation duties, and answer script management. Evaluated scripts are reviewed by HoDs, with results declared within a week via notice boards, WhatsApp, and the college website.

Students with valid reasons can apply for re-sessional exams. Answer scripts are shown to students for feedback, promoting continuous improvement. Final results are submitted to Gauhati University, ensuring a transparent and rigorous assessment process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

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4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Dr. B.K.B. College is committed to providing high-quality education despite challenges related to limited infrastructure. The institution optimizes its resources to enhance teaching, learning, and curriculum activities. The college has 22 classrooms, 11 of which are equipped with advanced ICT tools for interactive learning. A seminar and conference room facilitates academic events, while four specialized laboratories support studies in GIS, Computer Science, Instrumentation (Education & Psychology), and Performing Arts. The partially Wi-Fi-enabled campus houses 72 computers for academic and administrative purposes, with each department having a laptop and a departmental library.

The centrally located, partially automated library holds 17,256 books, 8 journals, 10 magazines, and 15 newspapers. It features two servers, four computer clients, D-Space software, and barcode readers. Students and faculty have access to e-resources via N-list, E-Shodhsindhu, e-books, and e-journals. The college also offers a modern 200-seat auditorium for academic and cultural programs.

Additional facilities include a women's hostel, canteen, common rooms, gymnasium, yoga center, sports amenities, and the Bapuji Playground nearby. Solar-powered lighting, CCTV, biometric systems, and ramps ensure safety and accessibility, fostering holistic student growth.

Gymnasium: The college hosts a well-maintained, fully-equipped gymnasium accessible to students, faculty, and the local community at affordable rates. Supervised by a certified instructor, the Teacher-in-Charge, and the Students' Union Secretary, the gym promotes physical fitness and wellness. Additionally, students enrolled in the Gym Assistant programme under PMKVY use equipment at DJ Fitness Center, Puranigudam.

Yoga Centre: The Yoga and Meditation Centre focuses on mental and physical well-being, offering a certificate course in Yoga for Health and a Yoga Instructor programme under PMKVY, fostering stress management and mindfulness.

Cultural Activities: The college promotes creativity through cultural events in its 200-seat auditorium and two open stages. These activities enhance artistic skills, confidence, communication, and teamwork, supporting personal and mental growth.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The Central Library of Dr. B.K.B. College, established in 1967, has been a vital academic resource, continually evolving to meet users' needs. It houses a comprehensive collection of textbooks, reference books, journals, magazines, and newspapers. Operating on an open access system, it ensures convenient resource availability for students and faculty.

The library offers essential services, including Circulation, Reprography, OPAC, Reference Services, and a Book Bank for economically disadvantaged students. Annual orientation programs introduce new students to its facilities. Security measures include CCTV surveillance and a barcode system for efficient book management.

Embracing technology, the library developed an institutional repository using 'DSpace' and provides e-journals and e-books via the NLIST program since 2011. In 2019, most users registered for the National Digital Library of India (NDLI), and in 2021, the college joined the NDLI Club, expanding e-resource access.

Library automation began in 2010 with SOUL 1.0, upgraded to SOUL 2.0 in 2012, and recently to SOUL 3.0. Key modules like Circulation, Cataloguing, OPAC, and Administration are fully automated, while Acquisition and Serial Control are under development, reflecting the library's commitment to modernization.

Dr. B.K.B. College has continually advanced its IT infrastructure to align with the evolving demands of academic and administrative excellence. Under the visionary leadership of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the institution has achieved significant digital transformation.

A key milestone in this journey is the comprehensive redesign and sustained maintenance of the institutional portal, ensuring enhanced accessibility and functionality. The introduction of an online admission portal in 2019 revolutionized the enrollment process, streamlining operations for greater efficiency. The college website has also undergone substantial upgrades, integrating features that enrich online education and student engagement. These include Live Discussions, Online Classes, Class Notes, Teaching-Learning Materials (TLM), Mentor-Mentee interactions, and a Grievance Redressal mechanism. Additionally, an online leave application system has improved administrative efficiency.

Dr. B.K.B. College follows a decentralized and participatory management approach, engaging multiple stakeholders in decision-making and implementation. The Governing Body, as the highest authority, and the Principal cum Secretary provide leadership, while various committees ensure inclusive participation at different levels.

A key example of this approach is the Admission Committee, which reflects decentralization and collective management. The committee includes the Principal as President, the Vice-Principal as Convener, and the IQAC Coordinator as Coordinator. 6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/perspective plan is effectively deployed

Dr. B.K.B. College has been actively enhancing its activities post-accreditation through a well-structured Strategic/Perspective Plan. This plan focuses on long-term objectives such as departmental expansion, fund mobilization, infrastructure development, digital facility enhancement, library upgrades, and extension activities. Additionally, the college formulates an annual Perspective Plan (Finance), outlining budgetary allocations and income sources. An Academic Calendar is also strictly followed for systematic academic planning.

One successfully implemented activity is the 'Computer for Computer Rooms' project under the RUSA Infrastructure Grant. This initiative facilitated the computer lab for Certificate and Diploma courses in Computer Applications, B.Voc in IT, and other scholastic purposes. Another notable project is the construction of an open stage, designed to create a flexible performance space.

The implementation process includes several key steps: drafting a Perspective Plan, advertising in newspapers, conducting Technical and Financial Bid evaluations, issuing work orders, procuring materials, and ensuring GST-compliant invoicing. Funds are released through PFMS in installments, with inspections ensuring compliance with work orders. Finally, the project is completed with a Utilization Certificate submitted

to RUSA, marking successful execution.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

Dr. B.K.B. College follows a dual-tier governance system, comprising administrative and academic sectors. The Governing Body, headed by a President, serves as the highest policy-making authority, with the Principal acting as its Secretary and holding the final say in academic matters. A structured hierarchy ensures clarity in duties, responsibilities, and authority at all levels.

The Principal is supported by the Vice Principal, Heads of Departments (HoDs), the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), and various internal committees. The administrative setup is led by the Principal, followed by the Vice Principal and HoDs. Within each department, HoDs oversee Associate Professors and Assistant Professors. The library functions under a librarian, supported by library assistants and bearers.

Internal committees play a crucial role in managing various institutional responsibilities. Each committee is led by a Convener or Coordinator, usually a senior faculty member, with assistance from other faculty and, in some cases, student representatives.

Service rules adhere strictly to the regulations of competent authorities like UGC and DHE Assam for permanent staff regarding appointments, promotions, and leave policies. Guidelines for contractual staff are formulated by the college authority in alignment with institutional policies and official notifications.

Dr. B.K.B. College prioritizes environmental sustainability and implements comprehensive waste management practices to minimize its ecological footprint.

Solid Waste Management: Waste segregation is conducted at the source, ensuring effective disposal of degradable and non-degradable materials. Approximately 25 large bins are strategically placed across Campus-1 and Campus-2 for systematic waste collection. Degradable waste is transferred daily by designated cleaning personnel to an on-campus vermin composting unit, where it undergoes decomposition. The resultant organic matter is then utilized as nutrient-rich manure for the college's gardens. Non-degradable waste, on the other hand, is disposed of in a designated burning pit within the campus premises.

Liquid Waste Disposal: The institution has an efficient drainage system that channels liquid waste generated from the canteen, hostel, and lavatories into designated soak pits.

E-Waste Management: Non-functional electronic equipment, including computer peripherals, printers, and scientific instruments, is systematically stored in a designated facility. Other electrical items, such as fans, lighting fixtures, water pumps, and defunct aqua guards, are housed separately. Reusable components undergo periodic repair and reintegration into the system, while irreparable e-waste is auctioned following the prescribed institutional protocols.

Through these well-structured waste management initiatives, the College remains committed to fostering a sustainable and environmentally responsible campus.
